Artsy Fun - Inuyasha Review



Inuyasha (犬夜叉, lit. "Dog Yaksha" with yaksha meaning nature spirit) is a Japanese manga series written and illustrated by Rumiko Takahashi (1996-2008, 56 volumes). Between 2000-2004 Sunrise studio adapted the manga into an anime television series (167 episodes (8 seasons), four feature films and an original video animation (OVA).

The plot follows Kagome, a modern day Japanese school girl who lives on the grounds of a family Shinto shrine. On her fifteenth birthday, she is dragged into a well by a centipede demon and sent back in time into the Sengoku period (1546). It turns out she is the reincarnation of Kikvo, a priestess who had guarded a Shikon Jewel which evil demons and humans can use to become super powerful. Kagome meets Inuvasha, a half dog demon and half human being and they strike up a friendship. After Kagome inadvertently shatters the Shikon Jewel, the two of them go on a quest, battling demons and humans across Japan to gather up pieces of the jewel.

Rumiko Takahashi is a very talented high fantasy writer and *Inuyasha* delivers on weaving the modern and fantasy feudal worlds together. The plots are pretty tight and many episodes are about Inuyasha and Kagome encountering a demon or human they have to fight in order to find a piece of the Shikon jewel. This can seem a bit repetitive, but there are side stories weaved into the plot explaining the relationships between demons and humans as well as the origin of the Shikon Jewel. Every episode has a lot of action and my little one was screaming their head off almost every episode out of fear or excitement (it was a bit hard to tell). Given the dark nature and animated violence, it's best parents are around to calm down younger kids if they are watching this. For those that enjoy Japanese mythology and fantasy stories, *Inuyasha* is highly recommended. The cast of both Japanese and English voices are done very well, but I was a bit disappointed that the Netflix release couldn't get permission to include the Japanese opening theme songs and are replaced by an instrumental piece. If I had to rank the anime out of 10, I would give it a 8.


