
Latest Artsy Raven Podcast Episodes



- "Roads are for cars, sidewalks are for people" one of my friends told me this and I reflected on the fact that everyone is driving to get somewhere, as well as myself.

- Now I know why dad listened to a lot of Cantonese ballads listening to calming
 music or podcasts made me less angry in the car and helped me with my road rage


